Areas of current specific focus include:

- Testing a neurophenomenological taxonomy of states of consciousness.
- The neurophenomenology of spontaneous and induced states of consciousness.
- Dissociative processes and traits, including their relation to cognitive processes, in migrant and other groups.
- The relation between alterations of consciousness and performance in controlled psi experiments.
- I do not supervise students who only want to do research on psi. Students should already have an MA in psychology or a closely related topic and ideally also a publication.
